CHECK IN: Barrows must be in place by 5:00 p.m., Thursday, October 15, 2009. Animals will not be allowed to enter the barns until Thursday, October 15, 8:00 a.m. and inspected and passed by health officials. An approval card will be issued after inspection, prior to entering the barn.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

The show is open to purebred or crossbred barrows weighing between 230-280 pounds. An exhibitor (individual, firm, or herd) may exhibit a total of 6 animals and show a maximum of 2 animals per class (receive premiums on 2 placings per class only). Classes will be lightweight to heavyweight, not to exceed 15 animals each, followed by a championship drive.

The NC State Fair requires that each exhibitor (individual, firm, or herd) possess a valid current PQA number prior to entry, put the number on the back of the entry form and follow PQA guidelines. Exhibitors under age 8 will show under parents PQA#.

(No Oil or Powder to be used on Barrows.) Barrows must have at least 1/2 inch of hair. **Barrows clipped with less than 1/2 inch of hair will not be allowed in the barn. No clipping after check in.**

All of the animals as placed on foot will be slaughtered and will be eligible for premiums in the on-rail class. However, the Judge is instructed to disqualify and eliminate from competition any defective or unsound animals. Barrows that are obviously over age and barrows that are late castrates can be disqualified and eliminated. All barrows will be sold to a packer as determined by the Livestock Director.

The carcass placing will be on the basis of certification requirements, estimated percent lean cuts, and carcass quality as determined by the Carcass Evaluation Committee. Estimated lean cuts will be determined by conversion factors endorsed by National Pork Producers Council using carcass weight, loin eye area and fat depth.

Be sure and read the Health Regulations before entering. Except where noted, the general rules of the Fair and of the Livestock Department will apply and govern this Show.

CHECK IN: Barrows must be in place by 5:00 p.m., Thursday, October 15, 2009.

Animals will not be allowed to enter the barns until Thursday, October 15, 8:00 a.m. and inspected and passed by health officials. An approval card will be issued after inspection, prior to entering the barn. Barrows must have at least 1/2 inch of hair. Barrows clipped with less than 1/2 inch of hair will not be allowed in the barn. No clipping after check in. No oil or powder may be used on the barrows.

SHOW DATE: 9:00 a.m., Friday, October 16, 2009

RELEASE TIME: 8:00 a.m., Sunday, October 18, 2009

PARTICIPANTS: Exhibitors must be 18 years of age or younger as of January 1, 2009, and residents of the state of North Carolina. Exhibitors must be able to exhibit animal on their own without any help. The NC State Fair requires that each exhibitor (individual, firm, or herd) possess a valid current PQA number prior to entry, put the number on the back of the entry form and follow PQA guidelines. Exhibitors under age 8 will show under parents PQA#.

ENTRY DEADLINE: September 15, 2009

SALE TIME: 11:00 a.m., Saturday, October 17, Champion and Reserve Champion. Remaining will be sold at 3:00 p.m., in the Kelley Building.

CLASSES: (If less than 10 animals are entered all will show in one class.) (No oil or powder to be used on barrows.) Any oil used on Market Barrows will disqualify the animal from showing or sale. Classes will be determined after all animals are weighed with a maximum of 15 animals per class.

ENTRIES: Each exhibitor may exhibit a total of two barrows. Jr. Market Barrows must be owned by the exhibitor by September 1, 2009.

SALE: Champion and Reserve Champion barrows will be sold and each Junior Exhibitor will be afforded the opportunity to sell one barrow in the sale. (See sale department for details.)

EXHIBITORS WILL CARE FOR THEIR ANIMALS UNTIL RELEASE TIME. Any animals that are not properly fed and watered *will not receive any premium.*

HEALTH: The health regulations of the Veterinary Division of the NCDA will be strictly enforced. **Be sure to read these under "Rules and Regulations of the Livestock Division" before entering.** Any questionable health problems will be referred to the livestock director and/or the State Veterinarian. Animals with obvious abscesses (opened or unopened), ringworm, soremouth or any other contagious disease **WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE BARN.**

MILEAGE COMPENSATION: The State Fair Management will pay mileage \$.30 per animal, per mile for barrows exhibited in the Junior Barrow Show based on the one-way distance between the home county seat and Raleigh.

Exhibitors MUST COMPETE in the Showmanship Champion classes to receive any showmanship premiums.

Each exhibitor that is awarded a Showmanship Pin in class is automatically entered in the Showmanship Championship.

A separate Showmanship championship will be held for Junior (11 and under), Intermediate (12 to 14), Senior (15 to 18) as of January 1, 2009. The animal taken into the ring must be entered in the respective showman's name. The Showmanship classes will be held at 8:00 a.m. on October 17, 2009. Classes will be divided by age. The top 2 exhibitors in each class will be selected to compete for the Champion and Reserve Champion Showman of their age division. The Champion and Reserve of each division will receive a ribbon and plate.

CHECK IN: ANIMALS MUST BE IN PLACE by 5:00 p.m. Thursday, October 15, 2009
Animals will not be allowed to enter the barn until Thursday, October 15, 8:00 a.m. and inspected and passed by health officials. An approval card will be issued after inspection, prior to entering the barn.

SHOW DATE: 2:30 p.m., Friday, October 16, 2009

RELEASE TIME: 8:00 a.m., Sunday, October 18, 2009

PARTICIPANTS: This Performance Carcass Show is restricted to North Carolina resident exhibitors showing barrows or gilts weighing a minimum of 230 lbs. or a maximum of 280 lbs. on October 15, 2009. The NC State Fair requires that each exhibitor (individual, firm, or herd) possess a valid current PQA number prior to entry, put the number on the back of the entry form and follow PQA guidelines. Exhibitors under age 8 will show under parents PQA#.

ELIGIBILITY DEADLINE: Pigs must be nominated through County Extension agents or State Swine Extension Specialists (limited to 10 entries per farm, firm or family) by July 5, 2009. Pigs must be weighed on test between July 10 and 20.

ENTRY DEADLINE: September 15, 2009 and entry fee for the fair is \$2.00 per head.

CLASSES: Limited to 15 animals per class (no oil or powder to be used on animals) determined by weight. Market hogs must have at least 1/2 inch of hair. **Market hogs clipped with less than 1/2 inch of hair will not be allowed in the barn. No clipping after check in.**

ENTRIES: Each exhibitor may exhibit a total of 6 animals (barrows or gilts weighing between 230 and 280 lbs).

CARCASS PLACING: All animals placed on foot will be eligible for premiums in the on-rail class. All pigs will be sold to a packer as determined by the Livestock Director and carcass placing will be on the basis of certification requirements and pounds of lean gain per day on test as determined by the Carcass Evaluation Committee.

HEALTH: The health regulations of the Veterinary Division of the NCDA will be strictly enforced. **Be sure to read these under "Rules and Regulations of the Livestock Division" before entering.** Any questionable health problems will be referred to the livestock director and/or the State Veterinarian.
