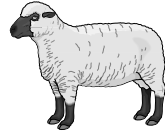

CHECK IN: Animals should arrive at the fairgrounds between 3:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m., Sunday, October 18, 2009. Animals will not be allowed to enter the barns until inspected and passed by health officials. An approval card will be issued after inspection, prior to entering the barn.

SHOW DATE: Tuesday, October 20 at 8:30 a.m.

RELEASE TIME: Wednesday, October 21 at 8:00 a.m. and POSITIVELY NOT BEFORE THAT DATE AND TIME. PREMIUMS WILL BE FORFEITED IF ANIMALS ARE REMOVED FROM PENS BEFORE 8:00 A.M.

COMPETITION: Open to the World

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Except in case of conflict, in which event the following Rules and Regulations will prevail, the Rules and Regulations of the Livestock Division, and the General Rules and Regulations of the Fair will govern this department. BE SURE TO READ BOTH BEFORE ENTERING OR COMPETING IN THIS DEPARTMENT. Some - but not all - are repeated herewith for emphasis, and others of the following Rules and Regulations apply only to this department.

MAKE YOUR ENTRIES EARLY! The right is reserved to reject applications received after all available space is taken.

Official printed forms must be used in making applications for entry. Entry form will be found in the back of this book. Additional copies are available upon request. Use separate forms for entries in other departments.

Be sure to fill in the application form completely, accurately and legibly. Give your rural route number, post office box number, or city street address, and zip code and telephone number. Be sure to include Social Security # or Federal Tax ID#.

Indicate on the form the total number of animals you will exhibit. Payment of \$2.00 per animal entered must accompany your application. Pen space will be assigned by the superintendent.

List the class number, as indicated in the premium list, for which each entry is made. Do not make entries in the Championship classes. Indicate if you plan to make entries in the group classes, but it is not necessary to name the animals which will make up your group entry until after the judging of the individual classes. Entries in group classes must have previously been exhibited in the individual classes.

All animals over three (3) months of age must be registered with their breed association in the name of the bona fide owner, who must have owned the animal for at least 30 days prior to October 1, 2009.

List on the application form the registry number, date of birth, sex and number of each animal. Registration papers will be checked prior to the show.

ALL SHEEP MUST BE CLEAN AND PROPERLY FITTED TO QUALIFY FOR ENTRY IN THIS SHOW.

No exhibitor may win more than two premium monies in any one class. In addition, premiums and ribbons will be awarded to exhibitors of N.C. bred and owned animals in all singles classes, excluding championship classes, provided the N.C. bred and owned animals place in the top half of the open class, or at the judges discretion if placed below top half of class.

Each exhibitor will be limited to one entry in each of the group classes.

The health regulations of the Veterinary Division of the NCDA will be strictly enforced. **Be sure to read these under "Rules and Regulations of the Live-stock Division" before entering.** Any questionable health problems will be referred to the livestock director and/or the State Veterinarian. Animals with obvious abscesses (opened or unopened), ringworm, soremouth or any other contagious disease **WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE BARN. All sheep must be appropriately identified and comply with USDA and NCDA&CS Scrapie Eradication Program guidelines. Call 1-866-USDA TAG (873-2824) or 919 855-7707 for more information.**

All shepherds in charge of sheep at the State Fair will automatically be considered to be entrants in this contest, designed to promote neatness, courtesy, attention to show requirements, and all around efficiency on the part of the personnel in charge of the animals in exhibit. The contest will start Monday, October 19, at 9:00 a.m. and will continue through Wednesday, October 21, at 8:00 a.m. The score card which will serve as a basis for the judges making their decision will be found under the "Herdsman's Contest" section of the General Rules and Regulations of the Livestock Division.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS TO MAINTAIN A BREED SHOW

A breed must have a minimum of three exhibitors and a minimum of 25 head shown in the individual classes to maintain a show. If a breed falls below these requirements, it will be automatically placed on a one-year probation. If a breed falls below the minimum requirements for two consecutive years, the show will be dropped.

STARTING A NEW SHOW, LIVE ANIMAL DISPLAYS

Space is not adequate to allow the addition of a new breed or display at this time. When facilities are adequate, the following rules will apply:

Application for new breed show must be made to the State Fair General Livestock Director by December 1 of the year preceding the date of the proposed show. Assurance of at least two exhibitors and a minimum of 20 head for individual classes is required. If the request is approved, a show classification will be added. A new breed failing to meet the minimum requirements to maintain a show (3 exhibitors, 25 head) during the second year will be placed on a one-year probation. The breed will be dropped if it fails to meet the minimum requirements during the third year.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Exhibitors are required to send in the Declaration of Ownership which may be found on back of the Livestock Entry Form. Animals, tack, feed, etc. will be allowed in the buildings on Wednesday, October 14 at 8:00 a.m. - pens will be assigned

CHECK IN: Junior ewes must be checked in at the sheep barn between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 15, 2009. Purebred ewes must be registered and be accompanied by the registration certificates. **NOTE:** Exhibitors will need to check-in with personnel located in the Kelley Building prior to unloading their sheep to receive pen assignment. If exhibitors desire to pen together with a group, give the total number of sheep for that group at the time the first pen is assigned. There will be no reserving pens, and any sheep penned without prior approval may be ejected from the fairgrounds and not allowed to show. Animals will not be allowed to enter the barns until inspected and passed by health officials. An approval card will be issued after inspection, prior to entering the barn.

SHOW DATE: Lambs will be shown at 8:00 a.m. on Friday, October 16, 2009.

RELEASE TIME: Exhibitors will feed and care for their ewes during the fair. All lambs except purebred lambs entered in the open show will be released from the sheep barn at 10:00 p.m. Saturday night and out of pens by 9:00 a.m., Sunday, October 18, 2009.

1. Use a separate entry form for Junior Ewe and Junior Market Lamb entries.
2. Exhibitors must be residents of North Carolina and be under 21 years of age as of January 1, 2009. Exhibitors must be able to exhibit animal on their own without any assistance.
3. Completed entry forms will include the name, social security number and telephone number of the exhibitor for each animal. **Check the entry carefully before mailing.** No substituting of animals will be allowed, and exhibitors cannot switch animals at check-in.
4. Exhibitors must have worked with the sheep they are showing for at least 60 days before the show date.
5. Exhibitors must have trained and fitted their entries. Major fitting should be done prior to arrival at the fair.
6. The health regulations of the Veterinary Division of the NCDA will be strictly enforced. **Be sure to read these under "Rules and Regulations of the Livestock Division" before entering.** Any questionable health problems will be referred to the livestock director and/or the State Veterinarian. Animals with obvious abscesses (opened or unopened), ringworm, soremouth or any other contagious disease **WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE BARN. All sheep must be appropriately identified and comply with USDA and NCDA&CS Scrapie Eradication Program guidelines. Call 1-866-USDA TAG (873-2824) or 919 855-7707 for more information.**

7. Each exhibitor is limited to four ewes with a maximum of two ewes from any specific breed. Breeds shall be as follows: Suffolk Purebred, Dorset Purebred, All Other Meat Breeds Purebred, Commercial, and Hair Sheep. Example: (two Commercial and two Suffolk Purebred; or one Suffolk Purebred, one Commercial, one Dorset Purebred and one Hair Sheep. Each ewe can only be entered in one class.
8. Ewes must be shown as individuals. If a junior exhibitor has more than one ewe per class, the second ewe will be shown by a junior exhibitor approved by the superintendent prior to the show (8:00 am Friday). Substitute exhibitors must wear a special exhibitor number card issued by the superintendent. If someone other than the exhibitor listed in the program (or an approved substitute exhibitor) brings a sheep to the ring, they will not be allowed to show (the lamb will be deleted from the class). **Once the ewe is set-up, the feet shall remain upon the ground.**
9. Class size will be limited to 20 head. If the number of entries exceeds 20 head, additional classes will be formed based on age of lambs. If birthdate is listed by month only, it will be assumed that the lamb was born on the first day of the month.
10. All ewes entered in commercial classes will be mouthed at registration. Junior lambs must have all temporary teeth in place at the time of the show. Commercial senior (class NB109) and yearling (class NB108) lambs may have one pair of permanent incisors. Only lambs entered in class NB107 may be shown with a second set of permanent incisors. Age of ewes shown in purebred classes will be obtained from registration certificates. Superintendent will rule on all other questions regarding age.
11. Purebred ewes are eligible to show in appropriate classes in the open sheep show provided they:
 - (a) Are entered in the open show. *Use a separate entry form for the open show.*
 - (b) Are accompanied by an official health certificate as required in the open show.
12. Ewes may be shown either with or without a halter. Exhibitors with Purebred Suffolk, Purebred Dorset, Purebred All Other Meat Breeds, Purebred Montadales and Purebred Hampshires may choose to show their ewes with an assistant setting the hind feet. The exhibitor of the ewe in class must be controlling the head of the ewe and the assistant must be a youth with an entry in the Jr. Ewe Meat Breeds Show.
13. The Junior Wool Breed Show is Department SB.
14. **The closing date for entries shall be September 15, 2009.**

Bred and Born award will be made from the top placing lamb from each class which is eligible for the award if the Supreme Grand Champion or Supreme Reserve Grand Champion ewes are not eligible.

A pin with an attached ribbon will be presented to the top placing North Carolina Bred and Born ewe from each class. If presented with this award, please bring your ewe to the holding area during the selection of *Supreme Grand Champion* and *Supreme Reserve Grand Champion* ewe. If a youth has two ewes eligible, please check with the ewe superintendent for approval for another youth to show the second ewe. If the *Supreme Grand Champion* or *Supreme Reserve Grand Champion* ewe is North Carolina Bred and Born, they will automatically win. If not, the other ewes that received the award will then enter the ring and the judge will select a North Carolina Bred and Born Grand and Reserve Grand Champion ewe from that group.

Exhibitors are required to send in the Declaration of Ownership which may be found on back of the Livestock Entry Form Animals, tack, feed, etc. will be allowed in the buildings on Wednesday, October 14 at 8:00 a.m. - pens will be assigned

CHECK IN: Lambs will be weighed and tagged between 10:00 a.m. to noon and 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m., Thursday, October 15, 2009. NOTE: Exhibitors will need to check-in with personnel located in the Kelley Building prior to unloading their sheep to receive pen assignment. If exhibitors desire to pen together with a group, give the total number of sheep for that group at the time the first pen is assigned. There will be no reserving pens, and any sheep penned without prior approval may be ejected from the fair-grounds and not allowed to show. Animals will not be allowed to enter the barns until inspected and passed by health officials. An approval card will be issued after inspection, prior to entering the barn.

SHOW DATE: Lambs will be shown Friday, October 16, 2009, beginning at 1:00 p.m.

RELEASE TIME: Exhibitors will feed and care for all their animals during the Fair until animals are delivered to the Lamb Sale Coordinator at 8:00 a.m., Sunday, October 18, 2009. Any exhibitor who fails to deliver their lamb or lambs WILL FORFEIT THEIR PREMIUMS.

The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Jr. Market Lambs will be on display in an area designated by the Livestock Department. Premiums will be forfeited if animals are not kept in the designated display area.

1. Exhibitors must be residents of North Carolina and 18 years of age or younger as of January 1, 2009. Exhibitors must be able to exhibit animal on their own without any assistance.
2. Lambs must be owned by the exhibitor at least 60 days before show date.
3. Lambs shown must be wethers.
4. Lambs will be shown as individuals. Each exhibitor is limited to two entries. There is no minimum age for exhibitors; however, exhibitors are expected to show their entry.
5. If a junior has more than one lamb in a class, the second lamb must be shown by a junior approved by the show Superintendent.
6. All lambs will be mouthed when unloaded and must have all temporary (baby) teeth in place at the time of the show.
7. Fleece must be dry at weighing, and lambs must weigh between 90 and 145 pounds. **No reweighs will be allowed.**

8. Lamb show entries must be made on different entry form than sheep in open show, or junior ewe show.
9. Class size will be limited to 20 head. If the number of entries exceeds 20 the entries will be divided to form additional classes at the discretion of the Superintendent.
10. Major fitting should be done prior to arrival at the Fair.
11. The closing date for entries shall be September 15, 2009. Entries must include Social Security Number of the exhibitor.
12. **All lambs which are entered and qualify to show will be sold. The first lamb checked in by an exhibitor will be auctioned off on Saturday after the sale of Champions. If an exhibitor checks in a second lamb, that lamb will be sold at packer support price and will go on the truck Sunday. No market lambs that qualify to show will be taken home!**
13. The sale will begin at 11:00 a.m., Saturday, October 17, 2009. Refer to sale section in catalog.
14. Any questions not covered by these rules will be ruled on by the Superintendents.
15. The health regulations of the Veterinary Division of the NCDA will be strictly enforced. **Be sure to read these under "Rules and Regulations of the Livestock Division" before entering.** Any questionable health problems will be referred to the livestock director and/or the State Veterinarian. Animals with obvious abscesses (opened or unopened), ringworm, soremouth or any other contagious disease **WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE BARN. All sheep must be appropriately identified and comply with USDA and NCDA&CS Scrapie Eradication Program guidelines. Call 1-866-USDA TAG (873-2824) or 919 855-7707 for more information.**
16. No pens can be used for equipment or feed storage. Please put at least three sheep per pen.

MILEAGE PAYMENTS

The State Fair Management will pay mileage for animals exhibited in the Junior Market Lamb Show as outlined here. Payment will be made for each animal (limited to 25 per county) based on the distance (one way) between the county seat of the county involved and Raleigh. For computing mileage, the official highway map issued by the State Department of Transportation will be used. Payment will be made on the basis of \$.30 per animal per mile.

JR. SHEEP SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST

The objective of the Showmanship Pin is to provide recognition to young people who have developed proper showmanship skills while working on their livestock projects. These skills will be evaluated separately from the quality of the animal shown, and will be judged while the youth exhibits an animal in the Junior Market Lamb or Junior Ewe show.

Exhibitors are automatically entered into this showmanship competition. Exhibitors must be showing animals they entered to be eligible for the award. Youth that show for another exhibitor will not be eligible.

Recipients of the Showmanship Pin will be recognized at the conclusion of each class. Youth may be recognized in more than one class if circumstances merit the award.

There will not be a set number of youth recognized. In other words, no minimum or maximum quotas exist. The Judge will simply recognize all youth that are deserving of the Showmanship Pin.

During the Junior Market Lamb and Jr. Ewe Show a judge will be judging exhibitors solely on showmanship ability. Those exhibitors that receive a Showmanship Pin are eligible for the Showmanship Champion Contest on Saturday, 8:00 a.m. Exposition Center Show Ring. Classes will be as follows:

NC301 Novice 8 and under

NC302 Junior 9 to 13

NC303 Senior 14 to 18

NC304 Senior Plus 19 to 21.

Ages are determined the same as for showing at the Fair. Exhibitors must show the animal for which they received the Showmanship Pin.

Each exhibitor in the Showmanship Champion Contest on Saturday will receive a \$25 premium. The Champion Showman in each age division will receive a \$100 premium. **Exhibitors MUST COMPETE in the Showmanship Champion Contest to receive any showmanship premiums.**

JUNIOR SHEPHERD'S CONTEST

Up to five equal awards (\$20) will be presented to the top placing individuals in the Junior Shepherd's Contest. All junior sheep exhibitors are automatically considered to be entrants in this contest designed to promote neatness, courtesy, attention to show requirements, and all around efficiency on the part of personnel in charge of the animals on exhibit. The contest will start at 4:00 p.m., October 15, 2009 and will continue through 5:00 p.m., October 17, 2009. Refer to Herdsmen's Contest" section of the General Rules and Regulations of the Livestock Division. Signs that clearly indicate where the sheep are from and who is exhibiting them are recommended, as are other decorations or educational exhibits that will interest the general public. Using a pen for equipment/feed disqualifies contestants because all pens are intended to have sheep in them.
